





This mural is part of Huron County's interactive mural tour. This digital mural trail highlights a series of new murals in our neighbouring communities of Bayfield, Exeter, Goderich, Seaforth, and Wingham. The mural's concept was developed in 2022 through the work of

a youth-led community committee that was formed through an open call. Throughout the image, you can spot iconic landmarks like Clinton Town Hall, Balls Bridge, the RADAR Atenna, and many references to our agricultural heritage.

RADAR Antenna | 20 King Street, Clinton, ON 18

light installations RADAR ANTENNA

In the middle of WWII in 1941, government officials scoped out the area around Clinton on a secret mission: selecting the location for the first radar training school in North America. They needed a place remote from England where the base would be safe and secret. They settled on the area just south of Clinton (now known as Vanastra) due to its discreet location and

because of the landscape. Huron County's flat land and shoreline resembled southeast England where aerial fighting was occurring.

In the summer of 2023, the radar monument located at the heart of Clinton joined the Spooner's Lane Light Tunnel as a historic landmark that becomes even more stunning at night! Visit after dark to see the radar illuminated.



light installations SPOONERS LANE LIGHT TUNNEL

The light tunnel was built in an iconic location in town: Spooner's Lane. The lane used to run between the town hall and a block of storefronts before they were destroyed by a fire. Now the space boasts a sparking light tunnel!

Thousands of lights strung between metal archways next to our historic town hall make a wonderful sight. The light tunnel is open year-round to the public. Colours and patterns are inspired by holidays and local events, plus there is an illuminated photo background sign.

The light exhibit celebrates people in our community. Let us know if you would like to see a specific colour sequence for any occasion!

Mistoric Sites CNR SCHOOL ON WHEELS


From 1926 to 1965, Fred and Cela Sloman, along with their young family, spent ten months of the year on a railcar travelling through the Northern Ontario bush. The car was part of a program called School on Wheels that provided education to students in remote Northern Ontario.

The program ended in 1967 and in 1982 the schoolcar was found nearly demolished.
Town Council purchased the car from CNR and moved it to Clinton!

Today, the schoolcar sits in Sloman Park and has become a museum where visitors can go on guided tours. Everyone is invited and encouraged to bring a picnic!
